



Welcome to our Guests! Thank you for coming to pray with us. You will find a weekly bulletin with today's hymns and a blue guest information card on the back table. The Three Great Feasts of Summer

- The Feast of Saints Peter & Paul (June 29): There is a spiritual link between this feast and Pentecost, for the witness of the apostles is the immediate fruit of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon them. The importance of the feast is marked by The Apostles Fast. The fast begins on the second Monday after Pentecost, which means the length of the fast changes each year. The week after Pentecost is Fast Free. This year the Fast has gone from June 16 to June 28. We break the fast today, June 29, so please feel free to bring meat and dairy products once again to Coffee Fellowship Hour. Incidentally, Fr David was ordained a Deacon in 2002 on the Feast of Ss. Peter & Paul by Archbishop DMITRI (Royster) of blessed memory at St. Seraphim Cathedral in Dallas. He was ordained a Priest on the following day, June 30, the Synaxis of the Twelve Apostles. May God grant him many years of ministry and joyous service!
- The Holy Transfiguration of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ (August 6)

• The Dormition of the Theotokos (August 15): This feast is preceded by a two-week fast beginning August 1. More about each of these in future bulletins.
