

Reports from The All American Council of the Orthodox Church in America, Phoenix, AZ, July 14-18

Thank you for praying for us! Fr David and our Lay Delegate, Ali Marie Phipps, will provide reports and reflections to the PC and the parish in the coming weeks. The All-American Council (AAC) is the highest legislative and administrative authority within the Church. The Council brings together the various elements of the Church to bear witness to her identity, unity, and mission. According to the Statutes, AAC convenes normally once every three years and includes the priest(s) and lay delegate(s) from every parish, as well as a long list of representatives from all church institutions. Did you know that you are sending your priest to prison?! One of the many ministries of our parish is at Tomoka Federal Correctional Institution where Fr David visits one of our adopted members, Moses, for whom we pray every Sunday. The Orthodox Church here in the USA has over 700 members who have become followers of Christ through prison ministries. Orthodox Christian Prison Ministries (OCPM) is an important ministry to individuals and parishes involved in obeying the Lord's command to make disciples, even in our prisons. The Three Great Feasts of Summer

- The Feast of Saints Peter & Paul (June 29): There is a spiritual link between this feast and Pentecost, for the witness of the apostles is the immediate fruit of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon them. The importance of the feast is marked by The Apostles Fast. The fast begins on the second Monday after Pentecost, which means the length of the fast changes each year. The week after Pentecost is Fast Free. This year the Fast has gone from June 16 to June 28.
- The Holy Transfiguration of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ (August 6)
- *The Dormition of the Theotokos* (August 15): This feast is preceded by a two-week fast beginning August 1.

We Are Growing... and there are two important ministries in our church community needing additional volunteers. These opportunities are open to both men and women who are chrismated members of the faithful at St. Alexis: *Greeters* & *readers of the Hours*.

- We also need volunteers to sign up to read the 6th and 9th Hour prayers before the Divine Liturgy each Sunday. Those who are signed up to read the Hours arrive by 9AM Sunday to be ready to start chanting 6th and 9th Hour prayers at 9:15.
