

Sunday of the Holy Forefathers and the Sunday Before the Nativity of our Lord:

This Sunday, Dec. 14, we remember the Holy Forefathers of the Lord. Next Sunday, Dec. 21, we will read the genealogy of the Lord (Matthew 1). These two Sundays remind us of the generations that have come before us who have helped each of us, both through adversity and encouragement, to receive Christ. We are instructed by God in Exodus (20.12), Deuteronomy (5.16), and Ephesians (6.1-2) to "honor our father and mother." As we look back on the natural generations of our own families, as well as the generations of the Lord Himself, we can see both holiness and sin, honor and disgrace. We aren't supposed to ignore the sin, dishonor, and brokenness of our forefathers, for if we do, we may fail to learn from their mistakes; we may fail to soberly assess our own potential to fall short in a similar manner. However, to truly honor our fathers and mothers, our primary focus should not be on

the negative things they have done or spoken about from prior generations. Fixating on these things and regularly speaking of them only serves to reinforce the brokenness to us and to our children, making it more likely for it to be perpetuated into future generations. As we remember our forefathers in these days, let us emphasize the blessed things, recalling the redeeming work of God throughout our family's generations, and thus focus on the thread of God's gracious work and pursue it with all that we have and all that we are. If we do this, we not only honor our fathers and mothers, but we also proclaim the gospel to our own generation.

On December 21, Michael Pierre and Kenadea Nelson will be received into the fullness of the Orthodox faith by chrismation. It is our local tradition to present a gift basket for each family unit being received by baptism and/or chrismation. Baskets have been brought today by sponsors Jim Humphries and Karla Anna Ayer and placed on the Litya table, clearly labeled with Michael's & Kenadea's names. **All are invited to bring gift items to fill the baskets**. Some gift ideas include icons, incense, charcoal, small home censer, books, cards, tasty treats, gift cards, letters or cards of welcome. Most of all, keep Michael (Seraphim *of Sarov*) and Kenadea (Mary *of* Egypt) and their sponsors in your prayers in these days of preparation.

Capital Campaign 2025-2026 Begins December 1st

Due to our growth we are going to need more space than we originally planned a year ago, and that means we need to increase our Building Fund.

This decision of the PC was affirmed when we received a pledge of a Matching Grant of \$200,000. For every dollar you give, it will be doubled up to the full amount of the grant! This begins NOW and will end on St. Thomas Sunday, April 19, 2026. All pledges for the campaign are due by St. Thomas Sunday, April 19, 2026. Our goal, including the matching funds, is \$400K.

If we reach our goal, the building we are currently considering could be ours with no debt. For every dollar above our goal, we will have funds to do minor remodeling, turning it into a beautiful place for Orthodox Worship, including the installation of our iconostasis, currently in a storage facility.

Pledge forms are included as attachments with the bulletin email and are available in the back of the nave. Fill out a pledge form and place it in the Tithes & Offerings Box as soon as possible. Note that all checks or envelopes dated by 12/31/2025 will be credited for the 2025 tax year for IRS Charitable giving reporting purposes. Donations received after 12/31 will be credited for 2026.

Make sure any donation intended for the Building Fund is clearly marked with "Building Fund" written on your offering envelope and/or check.

Essential Orthodox Christian Beliefs — Encountering Orthodoxy through the Divine Liturgy
