

New Building Update and January PC Meeting

It has been a very busy period for the PC. We continue doing final "due diligence" until January 23 in preparation for the Closing on January 30. The professional inspection was completed with good results; Appraisal is scheduled; We are actively receiving bids on insurance and internet, and setting up Utility accounts. To our surprise the monthly management fee will be 40% less than we budgeted! All is on schedule.
