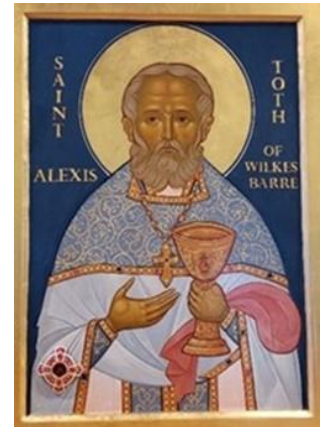

According to ancient Christian practice, Holy Communion (Eucharist) is served to members of the Orthodox Church who have made preparation through prayer, fasting, and recent confession, and who are at peace with their neighbor. If you are not a member of the Orthodox Church, you may be offered blessed bread (*antidoron*) by others in respect and love.

Today, Sunday May 10, is MOTHER'S DAY! “Remember, O Lord, our God-bearing, holy, and venerable mothers...” On Great & Holy Saturday a few weeks ago, many of you witnessed this prayer being prayed in the Service of Preparation of the Gifts. In our civil calendar we honor our mothers on Mother's Day, something we do in the Orthodox Church every Liturgy. It is a good Feast, this year falling on the 5th Sunday of Pascha. Many of us are Christians today because of the prayers of our mothers, grandmothers, and godmothers! For YOU we give thanks to God!

Annual Feast Day of [St. Alexis of Wilkes-Barre](#) is May 7

From the earliest days of the church and continuing today, people are often given a new name at baptism along with a new baptismal robe and a cross. The name is typically that of a Biblical “hero” or of another saint. The new name and robe represent joining a new family and putting on a new identify in Christ (Is. 62:2; 2 Cor. 5:17). The cross is the sign of Christians, not only to wear, but also to bear. We

celebrate a saint's memory not on their birthday, but on the day they died, when eternal life truly begins. The celebration of name days has been a tradition in Catholic and Eastern Orthodox countries since the Middle Ages, with local parishes also celebrating their "name day." St. Alexis Toth, our church's patron saint, fell asleep in the Lord May 7, 1909, in Wilkes-Barre, PA, and so our official parish feast day is May 7. ***Here is how we are honoring his memory this year:***

- ❖ **This past Wednesday evening, May 6**, we prayed the Akathist to St. Alexis at 6pm, followed by time with the catechumens focusing on his life and ministry.
- ❖ **On Sunday, May 17**, we will continue celebrating with our annual **St. Alexis Feast Day Luncheon** after the Liturgy. No need to bring food on that Sunday since the meal will be catered and served by our Parish Council members and other volunteers.
